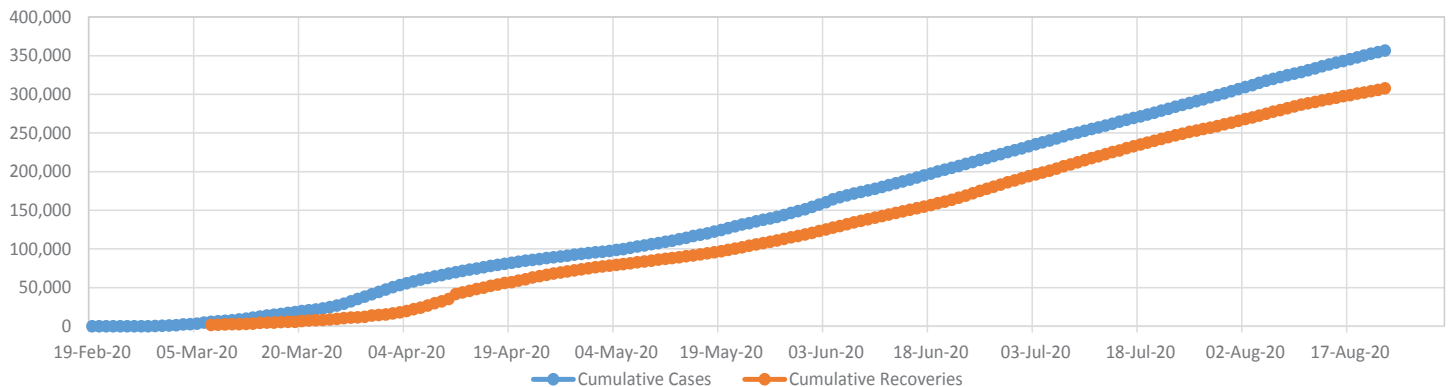
Daily Laboratory-Confirmed COVID-19 Cases, 19 Feb - 22 August 2020



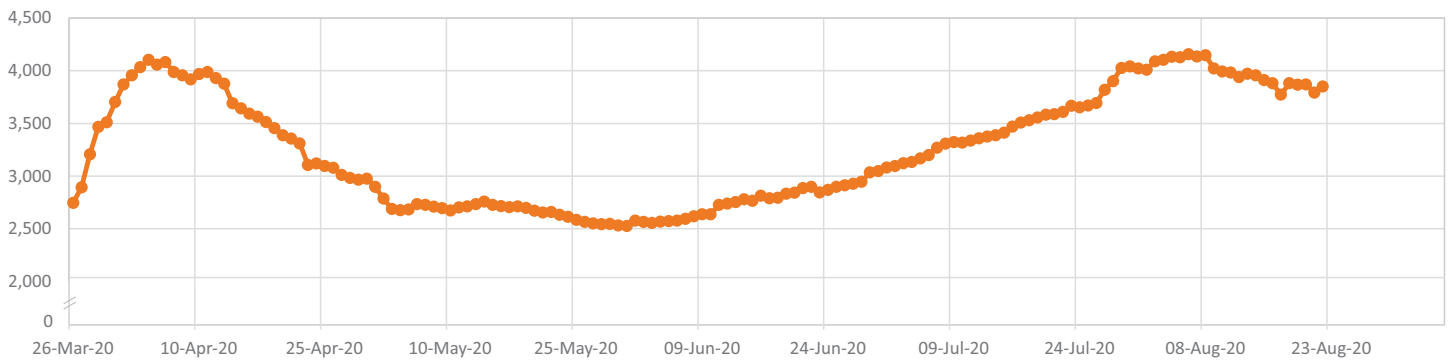
Daily confirmed COVID-19 Deaths, 19 Feb - 22 August 2020



COVID-19 Cumulative Laboratory-Confirmed Cases and Recoveries, 19 Feb - 22 August 2020

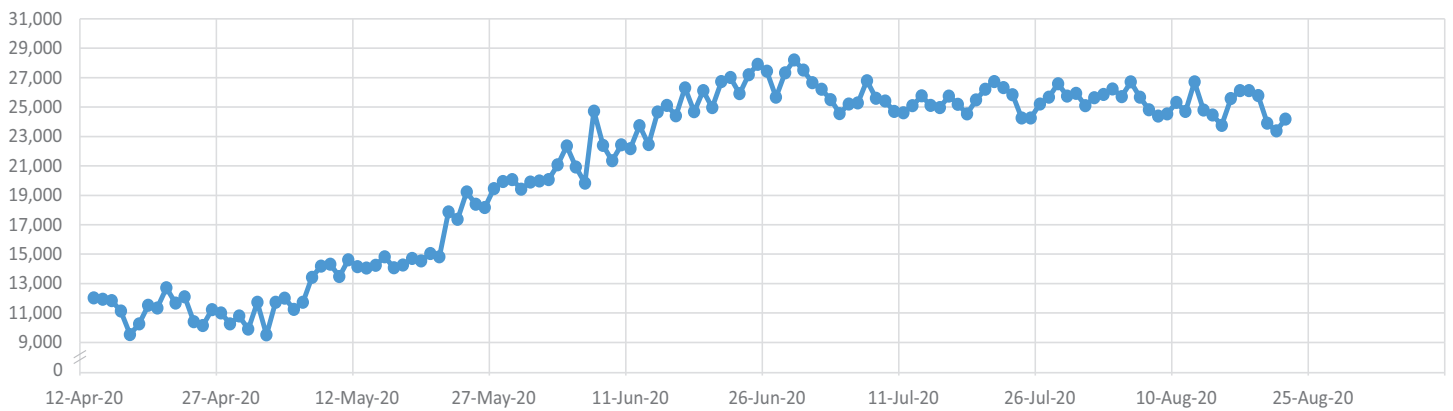


COVID-19 Patients in Intensive Care, 26 Mar - 22 August 2020



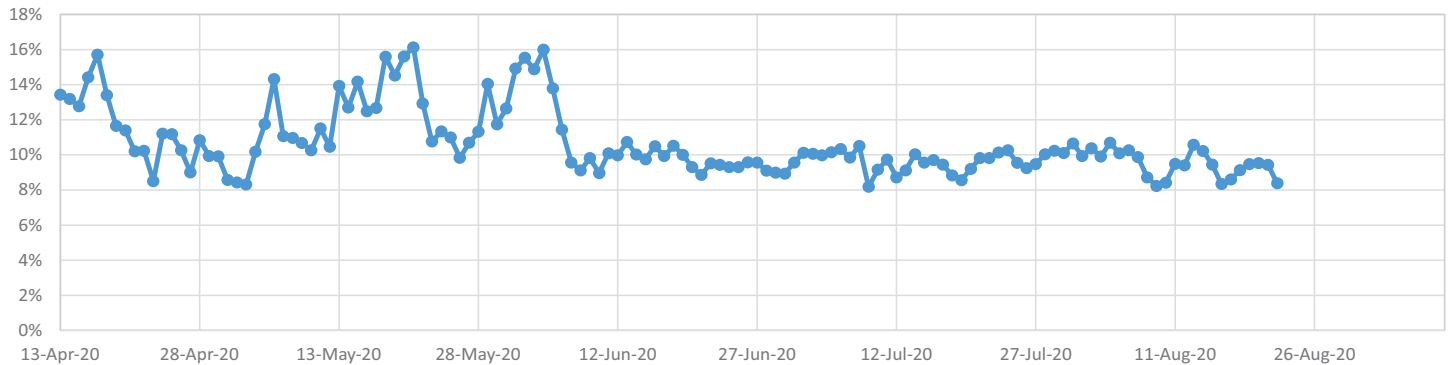

Total Number of Daily COVID-19 PCR Tests

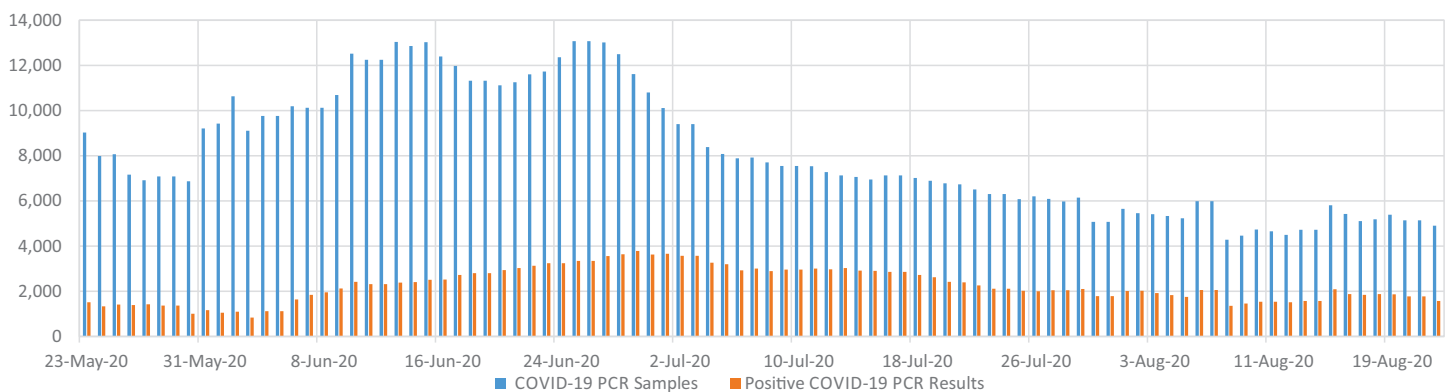

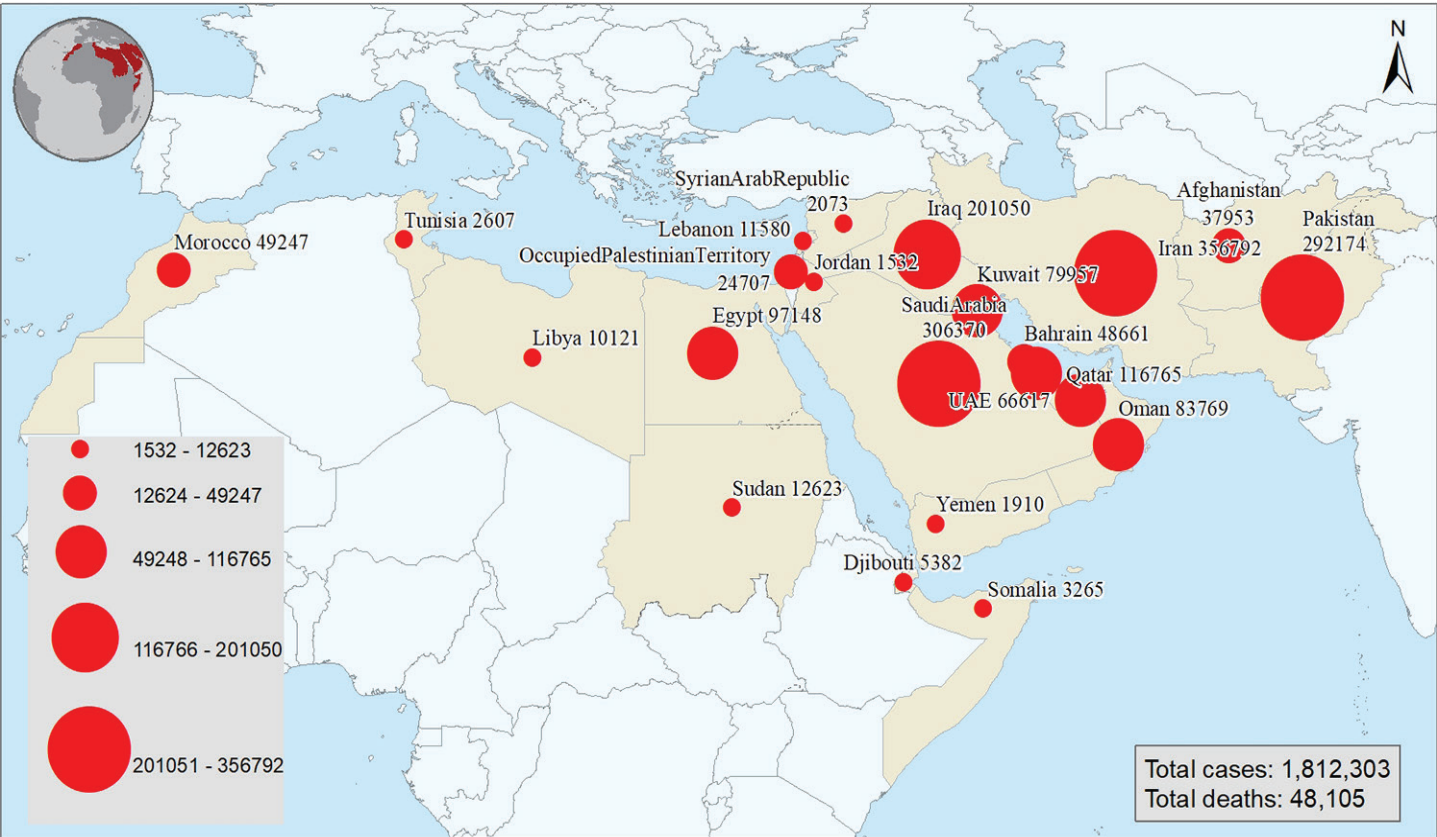

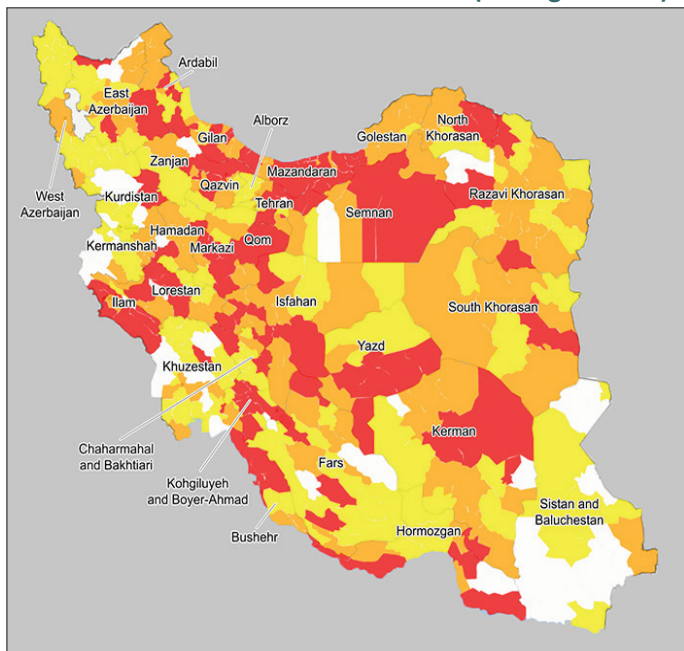

Arriving passengers and except nationals, all transiting passengers must have a medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before arrival/transit. Arriving passengers will be required to undergo PCR testing again in Moscow airport. In case of positive test result, passengers will be quarantined by the Russian Ministry of Health.

Travel Restrictions Imposed by Iran

1. All international arriving passengers are required to present a health certificate together with a negative Molecular (RT-PCR) COVID-19 test result issued in English or certified by Iranian consulate. Necessary arrangements must be made with the airline operators to avoid boarding passengers without the above certificates and should the health certificate not be presented on arrival, the passenger to be returned to the boarding country. In addition, it is necessary to carefully check that the health certificate or molecular test result has been issued not later than 96 hours before departure.

2. In case, at the time of arrival the validity of the issued certificate is expired due to length of travel or other reasons, another test would not be required. However, the passenger would be subject to medical screening and clinical assessment and in case of showing symptoms would be tested again. The passenger will be quarantined in assigned locations until receiving the test result and in case of positive test result, the passenger will be accommodated in assigned quarantine locations for 14 days. Passenger shall incur costs for the test and accommodation.

3. Those returning Iranians who at the time of arrival, have been out of the country for more than two weeks, are also required to present health certificate in English or validated by the Iranian consulate and stamped for Covid-19 molecular test. In case, due to valid reasons confirmed by Iranian consulate in the departure countries, it had not been possible to obtain health certificate or the molecular test, the airlines may conditionally board these passengers; however, passengers will be tested for Covid-19 upon arrival regardless of their clinical symptoms. These passengers must submit Passenger Commitment Letter and self-isolate until receiving the test result. In case of positive test result or showing symptoms, the quarantine period would extend to 14 days. Passenger shall incur costs for the test and probable quarantine.

4. With regards to diplomats, political commissions and local and foreign governmental authorities and international agencies staff, the health certificate and laboratory test from the departure country is not required and they will only be subject to clinical assessment upon arrival. In case of showing any symptoms, these passengers will be tested for Covid-19 and in addition to submission of commitment letter and contact number, they should be in quarantine in respective embassies or determined residence until receiving the test result. This group are not required to incur the cost of testing.

5. All Iranians and international arriving passengers (even representing health certificate) are subject to medical screening upon arrival and in case of showing symptoms or at the discretion of medical teams based in the border health control centers, will be directed to designated medical and diagnostic centers for more clinical assessments and testing.

6. All arriving passengers are required to fill out "COVID-19 Self Declaration Form" provided by the airline operators prior or during the flights and hand over the completed forms to the Airlines' agents. The airline operators are also required to share the list of passengers and completed self-declaration forms at the request of border health control centers.

7. Based on pre-defined procedures, all departing passengers are also required to undergo clinical assessment by a physician or health-care provider prior to departure in one of the designated health centers or at the airport. As per requirements of the destination country, health certificate or negative COVID-19 test result will be issued.

Copies of COVID-19 Self Declaration Form and Passenger

Commitment Letter are attached to WHO circular update No. 182/ 19 August 2020.

Wearing masks at all passenger terminals of Iran airports is mandatory.

Passenger are strongly advised to cross check with their air operators on the latest prerequisites and required documentations.

International Airlines

Qatar Airways: Currently operates two daily flights in the rout of Doha-Tehran as per the below schedule.

The Airline also operates four weekly flights in the rout of Doha-Mashhad, four weekly flights in the rout of Doha-Shiraz and two weekly flights in the rout of Doha-Isfahan.

Effective 13 August, Qatar Airways requires passengers travelling from specific countries including Iran to present a negative COVID-19 RT-PCR medical test result when checking in. Tests must be issued within 72 hours before departure, from laboratories that are approved by Qatar Airways, and paid for at the passenger's expense. Those that do not have a copy of their medical test certificate alongside a Passenger Consent Form will not be permitted to travel on Qatar Airways flights. Infants are exempted from PCR test requirements. Children below the age of 12 years are exempt from this test if accompanied by family members that have presented a negative test result. Children under 12 years traveling as Unaccompanied Minor are not exempted and must hold certificate of proof from the authorized medical center. Passengers must possess two copies of the test result and must fill and submit a consent form along with the RT-PCR test result. If passenger is returning within 48 hours from arrival to the country, another test is not required by Qatar Airways, but if the final destination has a government requirement, the new test is still mandatory (Further information at https://www.qatarairways.com/en/travel-alerts/COVID-19-update)

Emirates banned all carry-on items apart from laptops, handbags, briefcases, or baby items. Passengers must check in any other bags.

Turkish Airlines: All scheduled flights to and from Iran are cancelled until 31 August 2020.

National Airlines

Iran Air: Currently operates three weekly flights to London on Sundays, Tuesdays and Thursdays, two weekly flights to Paris on Mondays and Fridays, one weekly flight to Amsterdam on Thursdays, one weekly flight to Milan on Fridays and one weekly flight to Manchester every Saturday. Only the passengers with European residency card, Type D visa holders and long-term visa holders can embark on these flights. In addition, Iran Air operates extra flights to Madrid, Karachi and Minsk for the purpose of returning Iranians only.

Effective 8 August 2020, Iran Air operates weekly flights to Kuwait. As scheduled, on Saturdays one flight from Isfahan to Kuwait City and the return flight and on Wednesdays, one flight from Shiraz to Kuwait City and the return flight, will be operated.

Effective 2 September 2020, Iran Air will operate weekly flights in the route of Tehran-Madrid-Tehran on Wednesdays.

Iran Air allows only one backpack or handbag in the cabin. Trolleys will not be allowed in the plane. Wearing masks in the cabin is mandatory.

Mahan Air: Currently operates daily conditional flights to Istanbul and Dubai and extra flights to Damascus, Delhi, Moscow, Beirut, Bangkok and Kuala Lumpur for returning Iranian

Effective 6 September 2020, Mahan Air will operate two weekly flights in the route of Tehran-Copenhagen, on Sundays and Thursdays. The return flights will be on the same days.

Mahan Air operates one weekly flight to Guangzhou. Passengers above 2 years are required to have medical certificate with a negative Coronavirus (PCR) test result issued at most 96 hours before departure. Passengers are required to refer to below health centers for the required health certificate:

Currently some other national airlines such as **Taban, Zagros, Iran Airtour, Iran Aseman, Qeshm airlines** and **Kish Air** are also operating some conditional flights mainly in the route of Istanbul and Dubai for returning Iranians.
